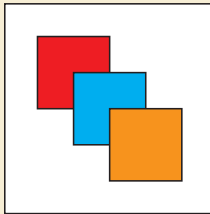


Understanding stacking order

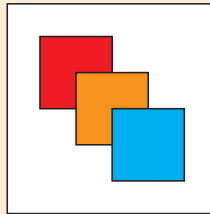
As you add content to artboards (shapes or images, for example) each new object goes on top of the previous object. This is called the *stacking order*. All of the content is layered on top of each other, and the first object created is at the bottom of the stack. Using the Arrange commands (or layers), you can reorder content, changing the stacking order of objects.

In the figure below, example 1, the red square was created first, the blue second, and the orange object was created last, so it's on top of the other two shapes. Each Arrange command applied below (for example 2 and example 3) has been applied to the orange object.



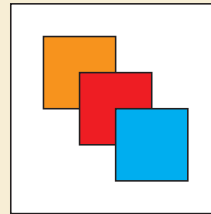
Example 1
